PROJECT BIHAR / LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

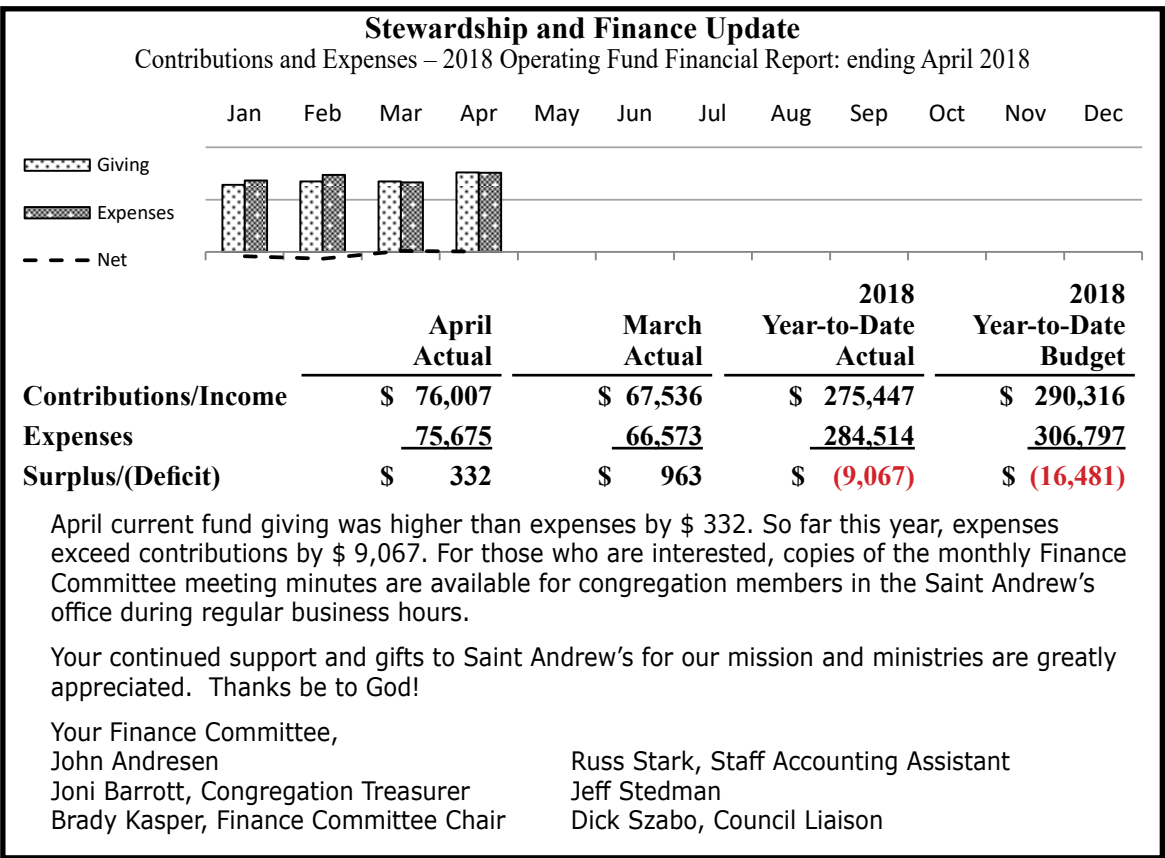


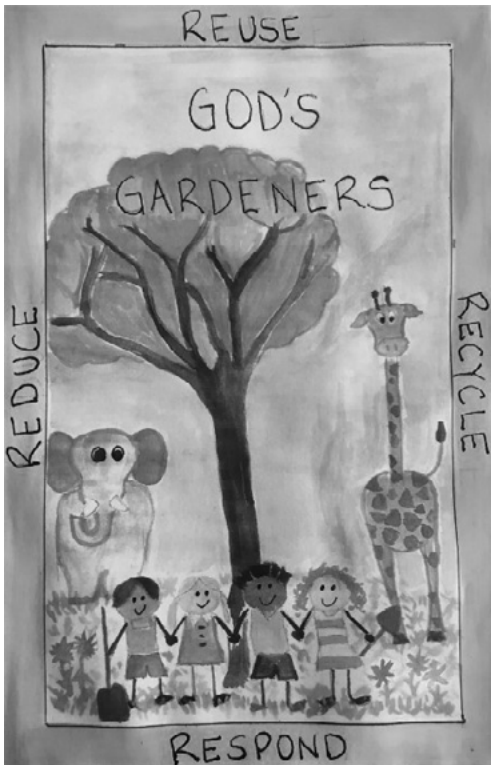
