PRAYER PARTNERS FOR LENT: During Lent, we have the opportunity to pray for someone at Saint Andrew's as we make connections with our Lenten (Secret) Prayer Partners. LENTEN BASKETS OF PROMISE (Items for Personal Care Kits): The *Baskets of Promise* program during Lent helps to fill the Personal Care Kits that are sent out in early May to Lutheran World Relief (LWR). LWR distributes the kits to areas of the world where an emergency has occurred, and people are left with very little. The kits supply basic items for survival. Our goal is to fill **150 kits**.
